Driving Directions from I-5 Northbound

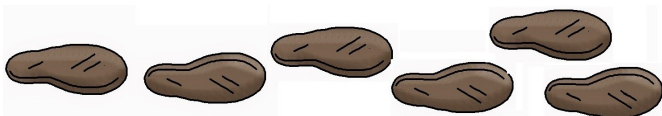
1. Take exit 102 (Trosper Rd/Black Lake)
