EXCEPTIONAL QUIRKS, PART 1

TIP 1: Be on the lookout for unusual errors and omissions, and always check actual or digitized images of original documents, if available.


QUIRK no. 1: Sometimes it takes a while to recognize errors or omissions in a database or document. They can come in all shapes and sizes. Ancestral File, Ancestry Public Trees, Pedigree Resource File, and RootsWeb WorldConnect databases all have one thing in common: **nobody** verifies any of the data submitted by someone else. The old computer-geek acronym GIGO—garbage in, garbage out—is only half-true: genealogy garbage stays in, but what's worse, it multiplies every time anyone duplicates someone else's submissions. For example, just because 512 trees for John Wilson of Augusta County, Virginia, show his death date as March 1773 doesn't mean it's accurate (and Burgess was *not* his middle name—that was his elected office title). So **RED ALERT:** "Ancestry Public Tree" is not a source! It's a copycat.

Birth years of parents are incorrect. The family was in Sugar Creek Township, Parke County, Indiana, at the time of the 1850 U.S. federal census: Moses, 44; Mary L., 30; Emaline, 21; William, 14; Isabela H, 8; Mary I. or J., 7; James P., 5; Lydia, 4; Winny E., 1.

Lititia (or Leticia) Burrows, who actually did die in 1804, was shown as the daughter of Philander Burrows, born in 1812/died in 1875, and Mary Jane, born in 1818/ died in 1880. Philander and Mary Jane may have had a daughter named Lititia, but not this lady.

The handwritten place of origin, "Ire.," was misinterpreted as "Ger." Although married women with "Mc" names may have been born in Germany, the men most likely weren't. Yet many of the 166 hits in this search showed Mc-people as German natives.



Crooked image caused an optical character recognition (OCR) indexing error. She was actually married in Boston in 1950. Other entries on this page and in this database are also wrong.

Note: OCR errors are common in transcripts or indexes of digitized city directories, too.

Transcription erroneously indexed godfather's name as that of the mother's name. Also, remember that church records are often in Latin: John becomes Joannem, Lawrence becomes Laurentio, Mary becomes Maria, James becomes Jacobus, etc. So search parish databases using Latinized first names.
