**Immigrant Communities:
Past, Present & Future**

Exploring “cluster genealogy”--the process of researching those relatives, friends and neighbors who lived near an ancestor--can often break down brick walls. This lecture will cover: How to identify chain migrations/cluster communities using key records; ways to share and collaborate with other researchers and the benefits, pitfalls, and obstacles; shifting to virtual communities.

**Silent Voices:
Telling the Stories of
Your Female Ancestors**

While most historical records have been created for and/or about men, making it more challenging to research and write about female ancestors, this session will demonstrate effective ways to discover your female ancestors and how to document the important roles their lives played in culture/society.

**Disease, Disasters, and Distress:
Bad for Your Ancestors,
Good for Genealogy**

This session will discuss how diseases, disasters and distress many have impacted your family's history and where to find the records resulting from these bad times.

Murder, Mayhem and Town Tragedy

Genealogy is one of the most unpredictable activities you'll undertake, and when you start digging into your family's past, “You never know what you're gonna get.” If you suspect a few black sheep lurking in your family tree, this session will show you, with examples, how to hunt them down, bust through the speculation, and tell the real story.
