of Richland, Washington, is professor emeritus of education at Seattle Pacific University. He holds degrees in history, Russian, and education and has written several books and articles on regional themes including Harvest Heritage: Agricultural Origins and Heirloom Crops of the Pacific Northwest, River Song: Snake River-Palouse Indian Oral Histories, and Finding Chief Kamiakin: The Life and Legacy of a Northwest Patriot, recent finalist for Washington Non-Fiction Book of the Year. He is a recipient of the Governor's Award for Excellence in Education and the Robert Gray Medal for contributions to historical scholarship. For over 40 years Dick has worked with tribal historians and elders on the Umatilla, Yakama, and Nez Perce reservations to assemble lineages of many of the region's First Families including the Snake River-Palouse, who resided since time immemorial in the Tri-Cities area. Careful study of original sources, census, Indian homestead documents, and oral histories yield meaningful insights into important tribal relationships and the history of the Inland Pacific Northwest.
